

Washington Hawthorn



The Washington Hawthorn is a small, colorful tree whose graceful white display of white flowers and bright red berries will brighten any landscape. Its berries are a favorite of songbirds and the tree is an important nectar plant for bees.

Washington Hawthorn trees are reasonably drought-tolerant. They grow best in full sun and where the soil has good drainage, and will grow well in a wide variety of soils.
